Key Message:

In 2019, an activist state court radically changed the Kansas Constitution, making it impossible to regulate abortion in even the simplest of ways. Unlike our neighboring states, taxpayer-funded and late-term abortion could soon be 100% allowed in Kansas unless you vote "Yes" on the Value Them Both Amendment August 2.2

Voting "Yes" on the Value Them Both Amendment:

- Restores our Constitution to the way it was before a 2019 court ruling cleared the path for nearly unlimited abortion in Kansas.
- **Protects existing commonsense restrictions** on the abortion industry.
- Safeguards Kansans' ability to have:
 - Parental notification for minor girls seeking abortion
 - o Clinic inspection, safety & sanitation standards
 - Our state tax dollars kept from funding abortions until birth
- **Is supported by healthcare professionals** because commonsense regulations ensure women will be safer, healthier, and more protected.³

The Bottom Line:

Since this court ruling, Kansans have seen the largest increase in the number of abortions in over 25 years, with the majority performed on out-of-state residents.⁴

Kansans don't want our state to become the abortion factory of the Midwest. We want limits and safety standards to protect women who live and visit here.

We must vote "Yes" to ensure Kansas does not remain a destination state for extreme abortions in unregulated facilities.

A BRIEF AND ACCURATE SUMMARY ABOUT VALUE THEM BOTH FOR PRIESTS AT MASS

Hopefully you have heard about the Value Them Both amendment that is up for a vote on August 2nd. This amendment, if approved by voters like you and me, restores our Kansas Constitution to the way it was before an extreme court ruling cleared the path for the abortion industry to operate in Kansas with virtually no limits or restrictions.

Since that court decision, abortions in Kansas have been surging.

Sadly, we are becoming a destination for abortion in the Midwest.

A YES vote protects bi-partisan restrictions on the abortion industry. A YES vote on Value Them Both is supported by all the Catholic Bishops of Kansas. It is also supported by a great many Kansas healthcare professionals. Commonsense regulations ensure women and babies will be safer, healthier, and more protected.

This is a separate issue from one being debated by the U.S. Supreme Court and the possible overturning of *Roe v. Wade*, a 1973 decision that legalized abortion in the United States.

Here is the important point: no matter what the U.S. Supreme Court decides on THAT issue, abortion in Kansas will still be virtually unlimited and unrestricted UNLESS we pass Value Them Both.
