

After months of prayer and discussion, Bishop Carl A. Kemme, along with diocesan and lay leaders, have identified several extraordinary opportunities and needs that go beyond the day-to-day. Needs that will help to fulfill our mission to "go forth faithfully to preach the Gospel to all God's children and to evangelize today's culture."

Capital campaign under consideration

For this reason, the diocese is considering a capital campaign to address these priorities. But we need your help, your voice and your gifts. The decisions we make now and the steps we take can help the Catholic Church flourish in south-central Kansas – not just for today, but for generations to come.

Bishop Kemme is asking every Catholic family within the diocese to share their thoughts regarding our needs and proposed funding priorities, including:

St. Patrick's Background




A fifth-century Christian missionary, Saint Patrick was born in Roman Britain in the late 4th century, before he was forcefully shipped to Ireland as a slave when he was just 16 years old. He found his faith while a group of Irish raiders held him prisoner. Saint Patrick escaped the shackles of subjugation, only to return to Ireland in 432 CE with the aim to propagate Christianity amongst the

Irish people. The patron saint instituted churches, monasteries, schools and other establishments in the country before he passed away on 17 March, 461 AD, etching that day in history forever.

There are many myths and legends associated with the revered Christian saint, such as the story about him chasing all the snakes out of Ireland or using a three-leaf clover or shamrock, to teach pagans about the Holy Trinity (the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit), given the significance of the number three in 5th-century pagan Ireland.




