**Reach Out** – Invite an inactive Catholic to come with you to Stations of the Cross, Confession or Mass with you anytime during Lent.

**Pray** – Especially for people you don't like and for people who don't like you.

**Tune Out** – Turn off the television and spend quality time talking with family members or friends.

Clean out Closets – Donate gently used items to our local thrift stores.

Donate – Pick a Catholic mission and decide how you can help by sending money, clothing or supplies.

Fasting on Good Friday - for ages 18-59, persons are permitted to eat one full meal and two smaller meal that together are not equal to a full meal.

Abstinence from meat - All Fridays during Lent for ages 14 and older.




